- JMW Turner Emblazons New £20 Note: The Bank of England has announced that a self-portrait of JMW Turner will emblazon the new £20 notes, with Turner's painting "The Fighting Temeraire" (1839) in the background. "It's so amazing that an artist has been chosen for the £20 note and an artist who was a wild maverick," said English artist Tracey Emin. The new design will enter circulation in 2020. [Artnet]
- Antonia Carver Steps Down From Directing Art Dubai: Writer, editor, and consultant Myrna Ayad has been named the new director of Art Dubai, replacing Antonia Carver.
